### BOOK OF JOHN STUDY SERIES

This workbook dives into the **book** of John in the bible to provide practical study as well as thought provoking questions for creating a meaningful interaction between you and God. For this workbook we look mostly at the New Living Translation which provides a relevant and accurate translation of the bible.

This workbook is by no means a theological approach, but is meant to be a guide. It is not the only way to look at the book of John, rather it should be an example and structure that allows you to begin a new adventure towards getting to know the God that loves you, created you, and has a grand purpose for your life (leremiah 29:11-13). We hope you enjoy this journey and that it can be the beginning of a deep, unique, and flourishing relationship with God.

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"Is Jesus really God? Some religions teach that Jesus is special but not that he is God the Son, who existed from all eternity and who created the universe and died to save you.

John makes sure you won't be confused. All the Gospels Tell you that Jesus is the Son of god. But John emphasizes that Jesus is the God of the Old Testament, the God who loved you enough to come to earth to be with you and to save you from your sins.

John the disciple wrote this book, not John the Baptist.

The key word in this Gospel is 'love."





In the beginning the Word already existed.


The Word was with God, and the Word was God.

- **2** He existed in the beginning with God.
- 3 God created everything through him, and nothing was created except through him.
- **4** The Word gave life to everything that was created, and his life brought light to everyone.
- 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it.





- God sent Jesus to be an example for us and to help us understand God better, we get to see that in the Word.
- The Word is the Bible.
- Jesus is a teacher.




The next day there was a wedding celebration in the village of Cana in Galilee. <u>Jesus' mother was there</u>, **2** and <u>Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the celebration</u>.



#### "Jesus Turns Water into Wine"

This video provides an idea of what it might have been like for Jesus to first show a miracle to the people in Cana.



- Jesus was spending time with his mother, brothers, and disciples
- Jesus' miracle was not only powerful, but challenged the status quo (the response of the bridegroom).
- Jesus was an amazing man. He had passion, purpose, and poise.

But Jesus didn't trust them, because he knew all about people. [25] No one needed to tell him about human nature, for he knew what was in each person's heart. -- John 2:24-25 NLT

What do YOU think about the scripture above? How do you feel knowing Jesus knows your heart?

There was a man named Nicodemus, a Jewish religious leader who was a Pharisee. 2 After dark one evening, he came to speak with Jesus. "Rabbi," he said, "we all know that God has sent you to teach us. Your miraculous signs are evidence that God is with you."


- Jesus came, not to judge, but to save people
- How does this compare to your current view of God?
- Judgement will come if you remain hidden and people remain hidden when they are afraid to expose themselves.

#### Where can you pray?

- Take a walk around your neighborhood
- Pray at the park on a swing

#### T.R.U.E. Prayer

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- Again, Jesus likes to break the status quo, he talks to a Samaritan woman.
- Jews would not usually associate with Samaritans, let alone men with women.
- This was rare, what does this tell you about who Jesus is?



<u>Jesus knew the Pharisees</u> had heard that he was baptizing and making more disciples than John 2 (though Jesus himself didn't baptize them—his disciples did).3 So he left Judea and returned to Galilee.

**4** He had to go through Samaria on the way. **5** Eventually he came to the Samaritan village of Sychar, near the field that Jacob gave to his son Joseph.



#### WRITE ABOUT IT

The woman was ashamed of her life and afraid of people's opinions of her. Do you feel ashamed or afraid of anything in your life?


Afterward Jesus returned to Jerusalem for one of the Jewish holy days. 2 Inside the city, near the Sheep Gate, was the pool of Bethesda, with five covered porches. 3 Crowds of sick people—blind, lame, or paralyzed—lay on the porches. 5 One of the men lying there had been sick for thirty-eight years. 6 When Jesus saw him and knew he had been ill for a long time, he asked him, "Would you like to get well?"

- Jesus really emphasizes the fact that he is from God and what he does on earth is to mimic and show who God is.
- Jesus is not trying to get anything from anyone else, he is simply reminding the people that he is here to tell people about the true God.

- (v. 5-6) Jesus sometimes allows us to be tested so that he might see where our faith is really at.
- There are two types of people Jesus was talking to in this passage, people who believed in God and were willing to follow him, and people who just wanted miracles (only good things).
- Which one are you?



After this, Jesus crossed over to the far side of the Sea of Galilee, also known as the Sea of Tiberias. **2** A huge crowd kept following him wherever he went, because they saw his miraculous signs as he healed the sick. **3** Then Jesus climbed a hill and sat down with his disciples around him.

#### T.R.U.E. Prayer

- Jesus is always reminding the disciples and people to look beyond what's right in front of them
- Jesus was a man of depth
- The more you learn about Jesus, the more you can learn about God
- The people were divided about Jesus



After this, Jesus traveled around Galilee. He wanted to stay out of Judea, where the Jewish leaders were plotting his death. **2** But soon it was time for the Jewish Festival of Shelters, **3** and Jesus' brothers said to him, "Leave here and go to Judea, where your followers can see your miracles! **4** You can't become famous if you hide like this! If you can do such wonderful things, show yourself to the world!" **5** For even his brothers didn't believe in him.


- We learn about the judgement of sin in this chapter.

Jesus returned to the Mount of Olives, **2** but early the next morning he was back again at the Temple. A crowd soon gathered, and he sat down and taught them. **3** As he was speaking, the teachers of religious law and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in the act of adultery. They put her in front of the crowd.

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. 2 "Rabbi," his disciples asked him, "why was this man born blind? Was it because of his own sins or his parents' sins?"

**3** "It was not because of his sins or his parents' sins," Jesus answered. "This happened so the power of God could be seen in him.

- Some challenges in our life simply exist so that when we learn and follow God, we can see his power more clearly.
- The Pharisees did not want to acknowledge Jesus' power so instead they decided to criticize and critique.






"God is Powerful - Deep Spirituality" This video looks at multiple scriptures that describe God's power.

"I tell you the truth, anyone who sneaks over the wall of a sheepfold, rather than going through the gate, must surely be a thief and a robber! 2 But the one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. 3 The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep recognize his voice and come to him. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out.



God describes himself as a shepherd. What might that mean? What qualities do shepherds have?

Here is where you can write in your thoughts or notes from the reading or bible study.



A man named Lazarus was sick. He lived in Bethany with his sisters, Mary and Martha. 2 This is the Mary who later poured the expensive perfume on the Lord's feet and wiped them with her hair. Her brother, Lazarus, was sick. 3 So the two sisters sent a message to Jesus telling him, "Lord, your dear friend is very sick."

4 But when Jesus heard about it he said, "Lazarus's sickness will not end in death. No, it happened for the glory of God so that the Son of God will receive glory from this."

- Jesus felt so much compassion and empathy for Mary and Martha.
- Jesus shared in the emotions that the people felt, he embraced the sadness, even when he knew he would raise Lazarus from the dead.






Six days before the Passover celebration began, Jesus arrived in Bethany, the home of Lazarus—the man he had raised from the dead. 2 A dinner was prepared in Jesus' honor. Martha served, and Lazarus was among those who ate with him. 3 Then Mary took a twelve-ounce jar of expensive perfume made from essence of nard, and she anointed Jesus' feet with it, wiping his feet with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance.



# "Read Scripture: John 13-21 - The Bible Project"

This video provides a visual introduction and overview of the Book of John. It should help you look at the second half of the book and its author to think about what God is trying to communicate with this book of the bible.




I have come as a light to shine in this dark world, <u>so</u> <u>that all who put their trust in me will no longer remain in the dark.</u> 47 I will not judge those who hear me but don't obey me, <u>for I have come to save the world and not to judge it.</u> 48 But all who reject me and my message will be judged on the day of judgment <u>by the truth I have spoken</u>. -- John 12: 46-48 NLT

Before the Passover celebration, Jesus knew that his hour had come to leave this world and return to his Father. He had loved his disciples during his ministry on earth, and now he loved them to the very end.



"What is Greatness? - Deep Spirituality"
This video discusses what Jesus is trying to show his disciples in chapter 13. Jesus washes their feet because he wants to remind them that what God values as great is not what the world values as great. How do you try to be great? How does this change your view of greatness?





"Don't let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God, and trust also in me."

- This is a great reminder that what you are reading about in the bible is about Jesus, and when you learn about Jesus, you are learning about God.
- When you obey the bible, you are actually showing God that you love him and that you trust him.
- There are so many promises that God has for you (remember the "God is Powerful" video from chapter 9)!

I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give is a gift the world cannot give. So don't be troubled or afraid. --John 14:27

### WRITE ABOUT IT

Knowing that a relationship brings gifts from God, in this case peace, how does that make you feel? How would your life look different if you had daily peace?

- A relationship with God is about remaining, or abiding, in him.
- Definition of abide: (of a feeling or a memory) continue without fading or being lost; live, dwell




"I am the true grapevine, and <u>my Father is the gardener</u>. 2 He cuts off every branch of mine that doesn't produce fruit, and he prunes the branches that do bear fruit so they will produce even more. 3 You have already been pruned and purified by the message I have given you. 4 Remain in me, and I will remain in you. For a branch cannot produce fruit if it is severed from the vine, and you cannot be fruitful unless you remain in me.






"Push Ups and Suicides - Coach Carter"
In the movie Coach Carter, Coach puts the team on a strict athletic and academic regimen. One player quits only to decide later he wants to rejoin the team. In this scene, on his own he does not have the ability to continue, but his teammates show him that together they might be able to do more. Think about verses 1-5 about remaining in God and how this might apply.

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"I have told you these things so that you won't abandon your faith. 2 For you will be expelled from the synagogues, and the time is coming when those who kill you will think they are doing a holy service for God. 3 This is because they have never known the Father or me.

- The disciples were Jesus' closest friends.
- He is constantly encouraging them because he knows that there will be difficult times ahead.
- These scriptures can encourage you to know that he knew then that you too, would go through hard times.



- We know that here Jesus is praying to God before he knows he will be betrayed and led to the cross.
- How does he feel about the disciples?



After saying all these things, Jesus looked up to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come. Glorify your Son so he can give glory back to you. 2 For you have given him authority over everyone. He gives eternal life to each one you have given him. 3 And this is the way to have eternal life—to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, the one you sent to earth. 4 I brought glory to you here on earth by completing the work you gave me to do. 5 Now, Father, bring me into the glory we shared before the world began.



# LOOK FURTHER

If we look at other gospels as they tell the story of Jesus, we know that he is wrestling at this point with having to go to the cross.

Read the passage below.

Then he said to them, "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me."

39 Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will."

40 Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. "Couldn't you men keep watch with me for one hour?" he asked Peter. 41 "Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

-- Matthew 26:38-41 NIV



#### "Sadness Saves Riley - From Inside Out"

Riley has experienced some hard times, moving across the states to a new home, new school, and new friends. She can't take the pressure anymore, but she has suppressed the feelings of sadness thinking if she shoves them away, things will get better, instead she realizes it's okay to feel sad because that's how she will feel the love she's looking for. How can you relate that to what you feel and sharing that with God?



- What might Peter have felt seeing his best friend go through such cruelty?
- Peter was wrestling with losing a friend and on the brink of losing his faith.



After saying these things, Jesus crossed the Kidron Valley with his disciples and entered a grove of olive trees. 2 Judas, the betrayer, knew this place, because Jesus had often gone there with his disciples. 3 The leading priests and Pharisees had given Judas a contingent of Roman soldiers and Temple guards to accompany him. Now with blazing torches, lanterns, and weapons, they arrived at the olive grove.






"A.D. The Bible Continues: Character - Peter"

In this cinematic look at Peter, we see that Peter struggles with who Jesus calls him to be and when he falls short of those expectations.









Have you ever been through anything difficult or hard? How did Jesus respond to difficulties in these chapters?

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## **KEY QUESTIONS**

- Why do you think Jesus didn't say anything?
- What do you think Jesus felt during this time?



Then Pilate had Jesus flogged with a lead-tipped whip. 2 The soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they put a purple robe on him. 3 "Hail! King of the Jews!" they mocked, as they slapped him across the face.



How do you feel as you think about what Jesus went through knowing that he was going to the cross for everyone's sins, including yours?

If you have Netflix, check out "A.D. The Bible Continues - Episode 1". The episode looks at the cross and creates a visual of Jesus' experience and his disciples' journey. Although cinematic liberties have been taken, the story follows as much to the truth as it can for creating a realistic and relatable image for viewers regarding the crucifixion of Jesus.




- Jesus comes back!
- He encourages the disciples to continue God's purpose!
- God fulfilled his promise.



Early on Sunday morning, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. 2 She ran and found Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom lesus loved. She said, "They have taken the Lord's body out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"

3 Peter and the other disciple started out for the tomb.





#### "You Say - Lauren Daigle"

This song is a beautiful reminder that no matter what we think of ourselves or what people think of us, the only opinion that matters is God's. God's thoughts about us are good thoughts and Jesus' death and resurrection was so that we might be forgiven of all our sins and mess ups, and instead have hope.

# READ John Chapter 21

Later, Jesus appeared again to the disciples beside the Sea of Galilee. This is how it happened. 2 Several of the disciples were there—Simon Peter, Thomas (nicknamed the Twin), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples.

3 Simon Peter said, "I'm going fishing."

"We'll come, too," they all said. So they went out in the boat, but they caught nothing all night.

4 At dawn Jesus was standing on the beach, but the disciples couldn't see who he was. 5 He called out, "Fellows, have you caught any fish?"

"No," they replied.

6 Then he said, "Throw out your net on the right-hand side of the boat, and you'll get some!" So they did, and they couldn't haul in the net because there were so many fish in it.


- Jesus asks Peter three times if he will feed his sheep. He does this to let Peter know that even through his guilt, Jesus looks past it.
- The disciples will have hard times ahead of them, but Jesus reminds them that their time with him has prepared them and God is with them.


