## Settle in

Take a deep breath. Turn off notifications on your phone if you can. Ask God to quiet your heart and help you let go of jealousy so you can be content.

## Scripture reflection

Read **Galatians 5:26 NIV** slowly. Then read it again. Let it sink in: Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other.

## Thought starter

Jealousy whispers, “Why not me?”  
Envy says, “I deserve that.”  
Competition shouts, “I have to win.”

But God invites us into a different way—one of contentment, gratitude, and purpose.

Here’s what we’ll learn in this quick quiet time:

- When we envy, we forget God’s powerful blessings in our own lives.
- When we compare, we get sad and self-centered.
- When we remember God’s generosity, we will be happy and loving.

## Why comparing makes us sad

### James 3:16 NCV

Where jealousy and selfishness are, there will be confusion and every kind of evil.

### Proverbs 14:30 NIV

A heart at peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones.

## Notes:

 **Truth bomb:** When we envy someone, we get self-centered and sad.

- Comparing ourselves with others makes us discontent, jealous, and sad.
- Comparing causes confusion, selfishness, and sin in our lives as we try to get things for ourselves.
- God wants us to have a heart at peace, content with what we have.

 **Reflect**

- Who am I secretly comparing myself to or competing with?
- Where do I feel jealousy creeping in?
- How is envy affecting my life?

 **Parable reflection: The workers in the vineyard**

Read Matthew 20:1-16 NIV or scan here to read it on your phone.



Jesus tells of a landowner who hires workers throughout the day—some early, some late. At day's end, he pays them all the same wage. The early workers grumble, feeling cheated. But the landowner replies:

**Matthew 20:15 NIV**

“Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?”

 **Connection:** This parable reveals the heart of envy: **the belief that someone else's blessing diminishes our own.**

- Comparing our lives with other people's will blind us to the blessings we have and make us think that God is unfair.
- But God's kingdom runs on his undeserved generosity, not comparison.
- He gives out spiritual blessings like undeserved kindness, forgiveness, and purpose to everyone.
- His generosity toward others doesn't mean he's forgotten us.



 **Lightbulb moment:** God is always generous, kind, and purposeful.

## Notes:

**Write it down**

- Write down one thing you're grateful for today.
- Write down one person you are tempted to compete with. How can you encourage them instead?

**Reflect**

- What do I envy that someone else has?
- How has God been kind and generous with me?

**Pray**

“God, help me stop comparing myself to others. It's hard to see what other people have and not feel bad about myself. Help me to be happy for them and to see the good things you've put in my own life.

Remind me that my life has a purpose, even if it looks different from someone else's. Please take away the jealousy and envy in my heart. Fill me with peace and joy about who I am. Help me to be a person who encourages others instead of being competitive with them.

In Jesus's name I pray,  
Amen.”
